# ADVISER MINUTE

## Learning and Leading in the OA

As youth enter school and grow, they will gravitate to their most successful learning style(s). The best educators and trainers will be aware of these various learning styles and will tailor their lesson plans to include these different learning preferences. The four main types of learning styles are:

- Auditory Learners (ears)
- Visual/Spatial Learners (eyes)
- Read-and-Write Learners (words and writing)
- Kinesthetic Learners (moving and doing)

These learning preferences follow each of us into adulthood, whether we realize it or not. Employers, therefore, tailor their employee training methods to meet the learning styles of their various employees. There are different categories of training methods to meet the needs of the learner types listed above. Scouting uses one type of training called **Experiential Learning**. After attending our Polestar Induction Leadership training, I realized that Scouting and the Order of the Arrow have worked hard to perfect experiential learning as the core training method of the Scouting program. Experiential learning bridges nicely over the various learning styles, particularly the Kinesthetic Learners, who need to be up and moving to optimally absorb information.

Successful Scouts BSA Troops use the **Patrol Method** to teach leadership. Each campout turns into a laboratory for youth to plan, manage, and lead. Troops that use the patrol method allow some failures to occur along the way so that Scouts can reflect and learn from those experiences. For example, how does one fix breakfast when the frying pan was left at home?

The Order of the Arrow takes experiential learning to another level. In the Order of the Arrow youth members lead events and activities. Hence, the adults are called "Advisers" for this reason. Youth members demonstrate amazing talents when they are given the opportunities and the necessary support to be creative. The youth leaders of our events create great experiences for the participants and those who are on staff.

The induction journey that OA members experienced when we join is also a form of experiential learning for the candidate. Candidates are given the opportunity to learn about themselves. How they relate to others and the world around them? Becoming an OA member should feel like an accomplishment and an inspiration. For many people a Scout's induction journey becomes Scouting's most unique training program.

Leading our candidates' induction journey is how members learn leadership. Planning, managing and leading the various parts of the induction journey is learning by doing or experiential learning.

- Unit Visitations and Elections,
- Welcome Events,
- Ceremony Teams,
- Elangomats,
- Event Leadership,
- Promotions

are just a few of the opportunities for leadership in the OA.

Many Arrowmen attend their induction, receive their sash and flap, then never return to attend or help lead an event or induction. Helping as a staff member or even just attending any of our events helps teach leadership skills by doing.

Numerous older youth Arrowmen have told me that their only regret is that they waited too long to become active in the Lodge. A couple of the reasons given by members who have waited are: "I don't know anybody" or "I want to finish my Eagle rank before getting active in OA."

I challenge each Arrowman to think about finding a small role as a member of a committee for an event or helping to organize a lodge service project. Consider being a member who visits troops and helps conduct their annual candidate elections. Do your best in whatever role you choose, while at the same time making that job your own. If you enjoyed that experience, then find a larger role in your chapter or the lodge, make that role yours, and do your best! Ask your chapter chief or an event chairperson how you can help with upcoming activities.

# CALENDAR UPDATE

Lodge officers will now be elected at the Fall Rendezvous in October. They will then take office on December 1st and be ready to start their program year in January.

OA Lodges are asked to meet national standards for delivering a quality program. The Lodge Performance Measurement Program (PMP) is much like the Journey to Excellence program that helps Scouting units assess their program delivery each year. PMP Lodge standards are measured for a calendar year. Lodge officers will now be elected in October, use November to set goals for the next year, and have December to finalize their ideas and kick off a great year.

Having the elections in the fall also coordinates better with school calendars. Youths who want to run for a Lodge or Chapter office will already know what commitments they have for that school year before elections are held in October.

Our Lodge holding its officer elections in October will benefit youth leaders who want to experience leadership of the Section or National OA. Section elections are held in September at Conclave. Our Lodge officers would be better able to finish their terms of office and progress rather seamlessly to a Section or National OA office.
