

SECTION G16 CONCLAVE RECAP

On September 9-11, 2022, the first-ever conclave for Section G16 was held at Powerland Heritage Park near Salem, OR. Over 300 Arrowmen from across the section gathered for a weekend of training, fun, and fellowship.

Friday night kicked off with the opening show followed by a special VIA Gathering – a special fellowship event for new Arrowmen inducted into the Order of the Arrow in the past year.

On Saturday morning, Arrowmen attended training sessions covering a wide-range of topics from Dutch Oven cooking using a propane stove and wildland firefighting to communication resources and ceremonies. Everyone was able to find something interesting and learn something new to take back to their unit, chapter, or lodge.

Saturday afternoon was filled with activities and competitions. From tomahawks to popcorn, Mario Kart to 9-Square, there were plenty of fun and entertaining activities and games led by some amazing volunteers. When it got too hot outside, shaved ice came to the rescue.

This year's conclave-wide game, Pathfinder Trail, utilized the conclave mobile app to complete achievements and earn points by completing tasks and scanning QR codes. A special scavenger hunt and the Conclave Spirit Award were also tracked through the app. While there were some technical challenges with the system, the game and the app unified many parts of conclave together.

Arrowmen "Bid High and Bid Often" throughout Saturday afternoon in the silent auction and on Saturday night in the live auction. This year's auction raised over \$13,000 for the section. Funds raised through the auction help offset conclave costs and fund year-round section operations.

On Saturday evening, everyone gathered for the closing show which featured promotions for upcoming lodge events, a keynote address from National Chief of the Order of the Arrow Timothy Reiss, and various award presentations. Mike Johnson of Tsisqan Lodge and Dan Hunker of Wauna La-Mon'tay Lodge were formally presented the Silver Antelope Award for their outstanding service at the National Service Territory level. The section also awarded three Arrow of Honor awards this year. Congratulations to outgoing section vice chief Ryo Takei, section chief Benjamin Flores, and the first-ever Gateway Region Chief Dirk Smelser on receiving the award for their exceptional service to the section.

The show came to a close with installing the newly elected section officers who will serve the section for the 2022-2023 year. Benjamin Flores of Wauna La-Mon'tay Lodge was reelected to serve as section chief, Jackson McCullough of Tsisqan Lodge was elected section vice chief and Jack Lewy of Wauna La-Mon'tay Lodge as section secretary.

OA MEMBERSHIP STARTS WITH YOUR SCOUTING UNIT

*** INFORMATION FOR TROOP LEADERS ***

Scouts and Scouters are selected by their unit to become members of the Order of the Arrow. If you are a unit leader or committee chair, this is a short explanation of the process to recognize your members with OA membership.

Youth Requirements for OA Membership

- Be a registered member of the BSA
- 15 nights of scout camping in the last two years which include one long-term camp of at least 5 nights
- Youth must hold the rank of 1st Class, Venturing Discovery Award, or Sea Scout Ordinary rank
- Be approved by your unit Leader

Candidate's Induction Journey

At the Election: The successful candidates are announced at the election. (*This is a National OA policy effective in 2023*). The Chapter visitation team will provide information about becoming an OA member. The team will also confirm contact information for both the candidates and their parents.

Shortly After the Election: Candidates and parents receive email info about the Induction weekends and an invitation to claim an "OA Candidate Portal." All information about the candidate's Induction is available in that portal, including links to "Induction Weekend" registration.

Before The Induction Weekend: Your Chapter will invite you to a "Welcome Event." There will also be a public recognition of your selection known as a "Call Out." Most Chapters conduct their call outs at the District Camporee.

Attend an Induction Weekend: All candidates are required to attend an Induction weekend to become an Ordeal member of OA. During the experience, candidates maintain silence, receive small amounts of food, work on camp improvement projects, and sleep apart from other campers. The entire experience is designed to teach significant values.

Completing Your Induction with Brotherhood: Ordeal members are able to attend all OA events and learn experiential leadership as part of the Lodge. After 6 months of service as an Ordeal member and after fulfilling certain requirements, an Ordeal member may take part in the Brotherhood ceremony, which places further emphasis on the ideals of Scouting and the Order. Completion of this ceremony signifies full membership in the Order.

Conducting Your Unit Election

The Visitation: Annually, the OA Chapter in your Scouting District would like to visit a unit meeting. Part of the visitation is an election of OA Candidates from the eligible youth of the unit. The election is conducted by the election team from your Chapter.

Scheduling the Visitation: In early December, Unit Leaders and Unit Committee Chairs start receiving emails about scheduling their unit's OA visitation. After submitting 3 available dates, the chapter and unit agree on the date of the visitation and election.

Preparing for the election. Three weeks prior to the election, the unit receives access to enter the names and contact information for their eligible youth into the Lodge's induction management system.

At the Election: The unit may be asked to provide the ability to show a short video. The election team will provide printed ballots, the election report and the ability to update the contact information for those people selected as OA candidates.

Approval of the Election: Shortly after the election is approved by the OA Lodge, the unit leadership will receive an email confirming the names and contact information of those elected.







Adult Candidate Nominations: The unit must elect at least one youth to nominate any adults. In the email confirming the youth candidates, there is a link to the "Adult Candidate Submission" form and the adult eligibility requirements. Units may select up to 2 adults for every 3 youth selected. (A unit leader candidate is outside this requirement.)

2023 EVENT FEES AND PASSES

New! Grizzly All-Event Pass

New for 2023, our officers have developed an all-event pass. Active members of the Lodge who attend all or most Lodge events during the year will receive huge savings on registration fees by using the new all-event pass. Purchase the "Grizzly Pass" and you will be registered for all Wauna events during the calendar year. The all-new "Grizzly Annual Pass" includes registration fees for WICC, the Spring Rendezvous event, the Fall Summit event, four induction weekends, the Vigil Induction and the cost of attending the College of Youth Leadership (CYL). The cost of these event registrations is \$260, if purchased separately. The cost of the 2023 Grizzly Pass for youth (under 21 years of age on the date the pass is purchased in 2023) is \$140. Adults may purchase the Grizzly Pass for \$170. "Roofed housing" at Camp Meriwether for WICC, Spring Rendezvous and Fall Summit will be available as an add-on option for an additional \$10 per weekend. (Our Lodge's Grizzly Pass will not include the Section G16 "Conclave" in September because that event is sponsored and paid for by the Section.)

Members with a Grizzly Pass will be asked to notify the Lodge if they are **NOT** attending a specific weekend. This courtesy notice from members will help the Lodge plan more accurately, keep food costs down and make roofed housing available for members who will be attending. There will be no refunds (neither partial nor full) offered to passholders.



Induction Leadership Pass

Our traditional "Induction Leadership Pass" is still being offered. This pass includes registration fees to serve at all four of the 2023 Induction weekends. The Induction Leadership Pass is for youth and adults serving as Ceremonialists (youth only), Elangomats, Induction Staff or helping with a member project for the camp. Youth Induction Leadership passes are \$40 for 2023. Adult Induction Leadership passes are \$70 for 2023.



Members may still register for each event separately. Single-event registrations and other fees for 2023 are the same as 2022 with just a few adjustments.

- 2023 annual Lodge dues are \$15
- Brotherhood Conversion from Ordeal membership NO ADDITIONAL CHARGE
- Member registrations for WICC, Fall Summit and Induction weekends are \$30 per event.
- Registration for Spring Rendezvous and Banquet is \$35 per member. There is a Saturday banquet-only option of \$15 per person.
- Candidates for membership in OA pay a one-time Candidate fee of \$60 for their Induction weekend. The Candidate fee includes weekend registration, 2023 Lodge dues, Ordeal and Brotherhood Sashes, OA Handbook and one Lodge annual pocket flap.
- Vigil Members attending the Vigil Induction may register for that single event at \$15. Vigil Candidates are FREE.
- ArrowCorps registration is not included in the Grizzly Pass. ArrowCorps 2023 registration for adults is \$225 and for youth (under 21 years old during ArrowCorps event) is \$200. ArrowCorps 2023 is open to any registered member of the BSA, whether they are OA members or not.

LODGE CALENDAR: Under the Resources Tab on our website, is our most comprehensive Lodge Calendar. The Calendar includes Lodge events, monthly Lodge meetings and planning meetings, Service Projects, and special trainings. Chapters can include any Chapter meetings, activities, and service projects by emailing dick.phillips@cpc-oa.org to have an event added.



There are two other calendars that contain Lodge event information. The Council calendar on the Cascade Pacific Council Web site and the calendar in each OA member's portal.

COUNCIL CALENDAR: This calendar has every District and Council scouting event for our large council. It can easily be too cluttered. The Lodge will limit our events on this calendar to our major events and induction weekends. This should be helpful to all members of the Scouting community. Scouters planning events have this calendar available to avoid a conflict with Lodge events. Each event listing will have a link to registration in Tentaroo.

OA MEMBER PORTAL: The calendar that is accessible in the member portal is for events and activities that require registration or completing an interest survey to attend. Events will have direct links to event registration. This calendar is especially useful to our elected Candidates to register for Induction weekends and become familiar with the Lodge.
